Arriving at the hospital

- **Hospital pre-registration**
 - We encourage patients to pre-register with the hospital during a prenatal visit, if possible. Pre-registration helps expedite the check-in process. A good opportunity to pre-register is at the 28-week visit, when many patients complete their glucose tolerance test.
- **Parking and entering the hospital**
 - We encourage patients to park in the lot that is closest to the Emergency Center entrance – these doors are open 24 hours a day.



Entering the Birth Center

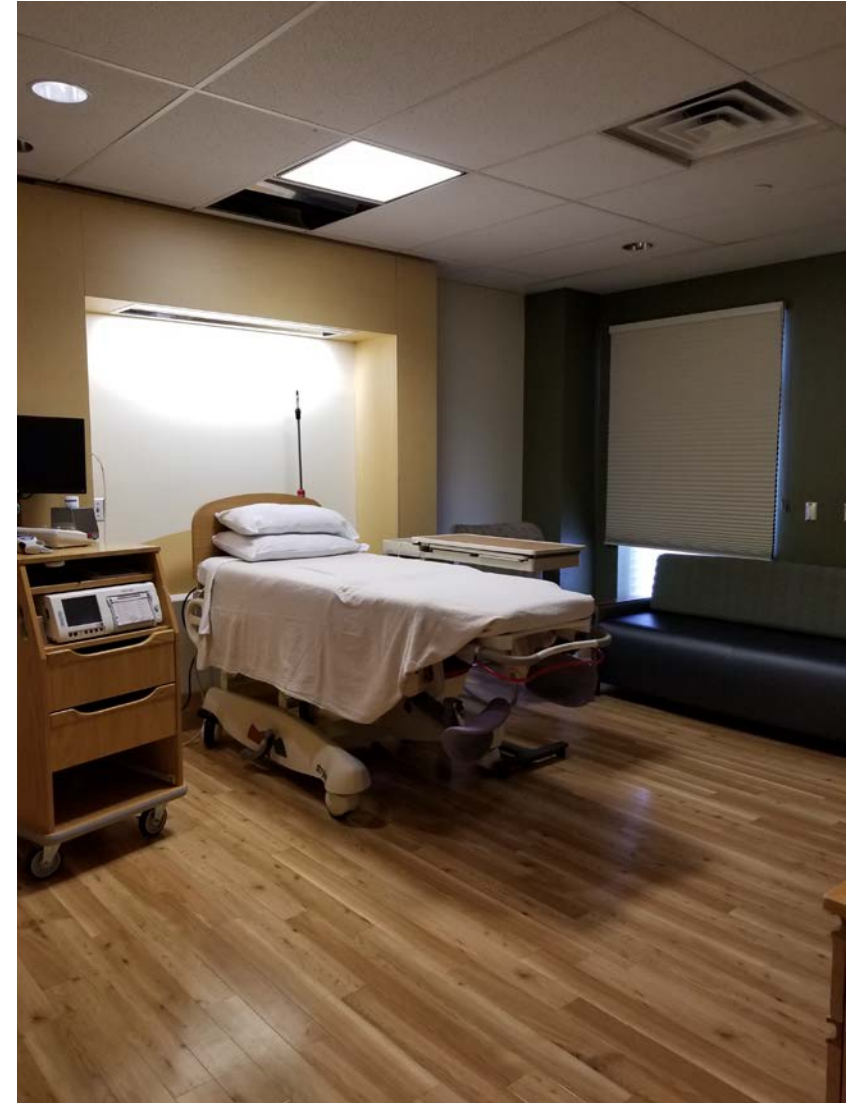
The Birth Center is a locked unit, which means patients will need to use the phone to call the care team and let them know they have arrived; staff will activate the door and allow patients to enter.



Birth Center overview

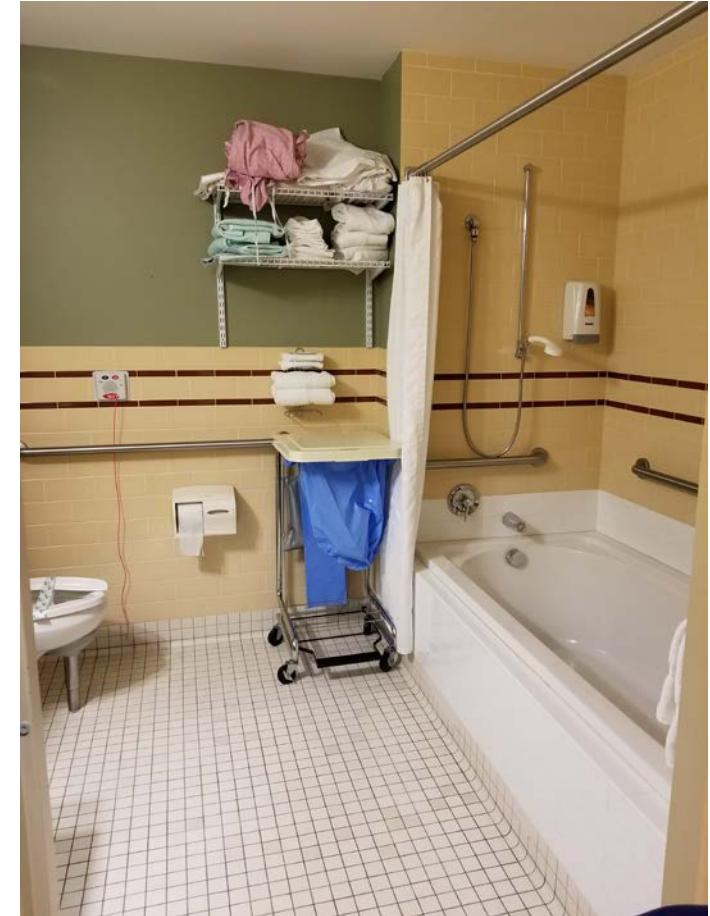
The Birth Center is designed with patients and families' comfort in mind:

- There are three main labor and delivery rooms and seven postpartum rooms
- All rooms are private with adjoining bathrooms. Each bathroom in our labor rooms is equipped with a large soaking tub.
- All rooms have sofa sleepers that allow labor partners to spend the night if they choose



Labor and delivery rooms

Rooms are equipped with fetal monitors to allow tracing of mom's contractions and baby's heart tones. Rooms are designed for families' comfort, with a refrigerator for snacks and beverages, TVs and CD players and Wi-Fi.



Communicating with our patients

Each patient room has a special message board that is used to help keep patients and families updated on important details about their care and supporting care team. The board will be updated throughout their stay.

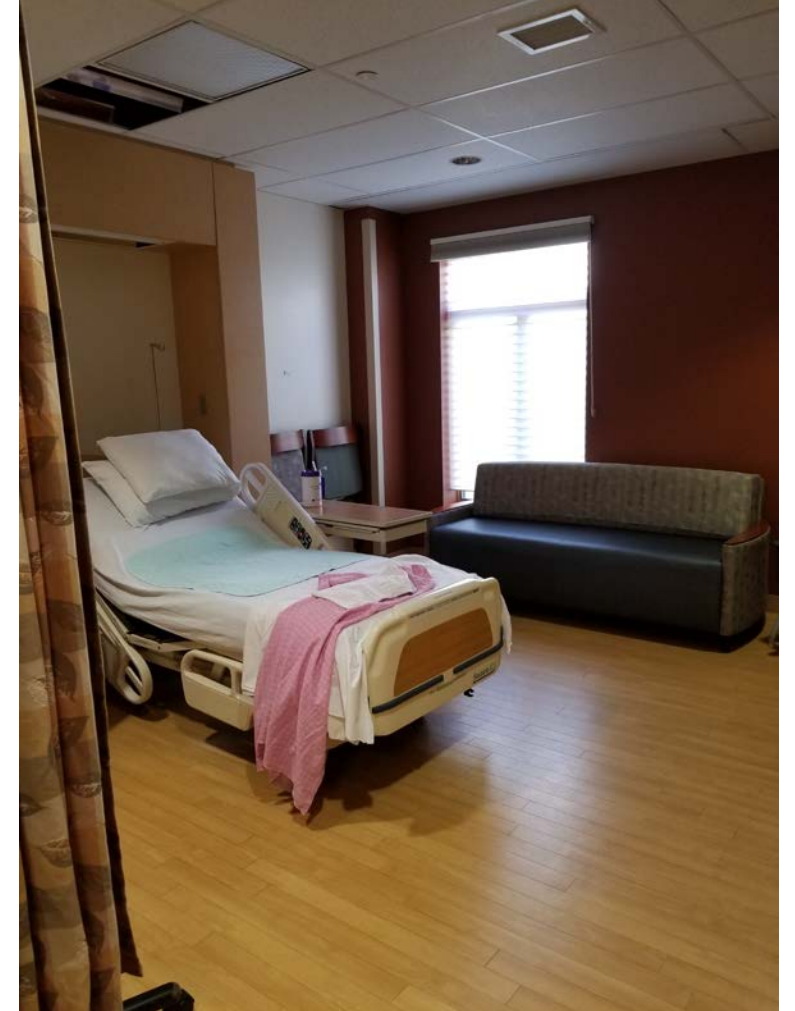
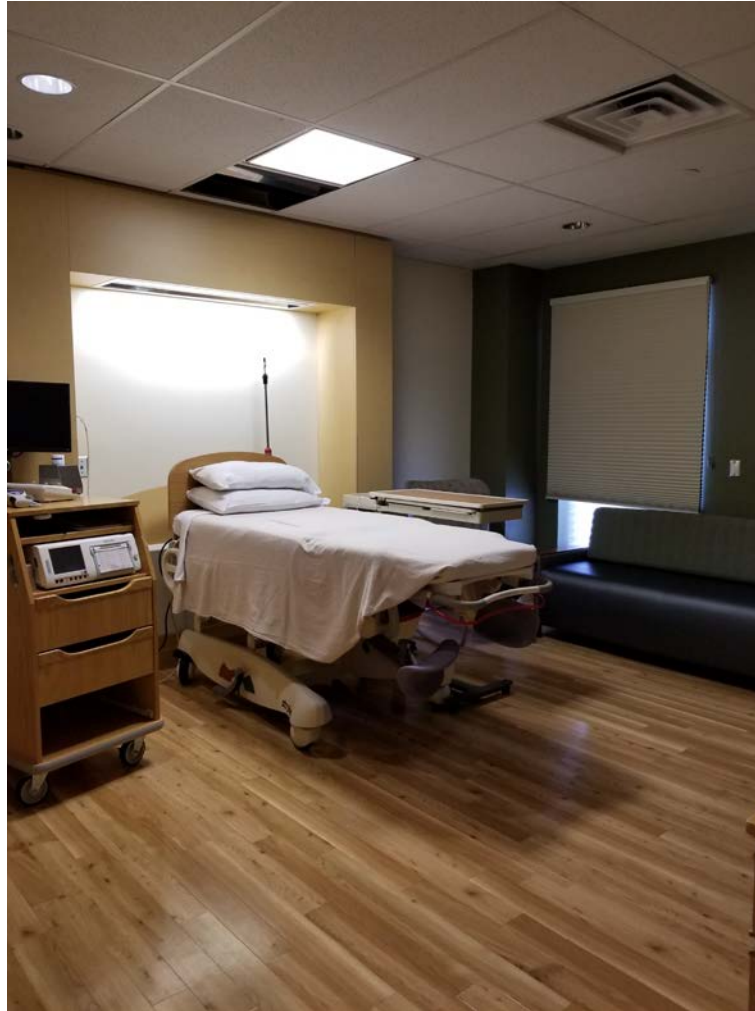
